Before you start...

Look at the **glossary of devices** (key terminology) on pages 6 and 7 of the AQA Power and Conflict Poetry booklet.

- Create your own mnemonics to help you group devices/ terminology/ techniques
- Use the 'look- cover- test' method. This can be done independently or with someone at home testing you.

• Create a poster of key terminology/ devices/ techniques to have displayed on your wall.
