



16-19 Tuition Fund Statement (2021-22)

The purpose of this statement is to set out how Sir John Hunt Community Sports College (SJH CSC) plans to utilise the 16-19 tuition fund allocation to support students who have had their learning disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The targeted and strategic use of this fund will reflect and support our college ethos and values, by encouraging and supporting our students 'to greater heights' through ambition, endeavour and respect. Sir John Hunt Community Sports College will utilise its staff body and structures to ensure that any students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) benefit from this fund where appropriate.

What is the 16-19 Tuition Fund?

The 16-19 tuition fund is a one-off funding allocation for the 2021-22 academic year only. The fund is being provided to support students to catch up and address any gaps in their learning which may have been impacted or exacerbated by the COVID-19 lockdown and school closures.

The fund will be used for small group and 1:1 tuition in English, Maths and Vocational learning for our 16-19 year-old learners. This tuition will be in addition to the planned study programme hours.

Who can be supported by this fund?

In line with Government guidance we will prioritise the following groups of 16-19 year old students, identified by the Government as disadvantaged, for support from the fund:

- Students who are yet to achieve a grade 4 in either GCSE Maths or English.
- Students with SEND (special educational needs and disabilities) where they have experienced additional disruption to their learning as a result of their specific needs and disabilities.
- Students who have achieved a grade 4 but also would benefit from additional catch up support or intervention due to disrupted learning.

Examples of the Tuition Support on offer will include:

- GCSE re-sit preparation
- Functional skills assessment preparation
- Individual needs analysis where necessary
- One to one or small group tuition
- One to one or small group tuition linked to specific gaps in learning from 2020-22

The tuition will be in the form of small group tuition, individual one to one tutoring and other supportive strategies based on an individual needs basis.

How will we record and monitor the use of the fund?

We will track, monitor, review and analyse the use of this funding and the impact of these targeted interventions on student progress and outcomes. We will monitor the use of funding to determine the effectiveness of the support / interventions and will adjust our strategies and interventions accordingly.
